REVISITING A

Thor's article was mainly directed as you can see toward officers giving guidance of how to handle these situations if they occur and may become detrimental to the Chapter. I think we all as Electric City H.O.G. "clique" when it comes to "doing H.O.G.", and I'm proud to call all our members friends.



CLIQUES: THE GOOD AND THE BAD

Over the many years we have been doing Harley Owners Group® Officer Training (H.O.T.) and one thing that comes up almost every year is the topic of "cliques. I guess a good starting point is to first define what a clique is. According to Wikipedia: "A clique is a group of "persons who interact with each other more regularly and intensely than others in the same setting." Interacting with cliques is part of normative social development regardless of gender, ethnicity, or popularity."

So what can we learn from this? Well first, we know that they are not innately evil. Second we know that they are not bound by gender, race, politics or status. Lastly I think if we come at this with an open mind, we might realize that we as H.O.G.® Members are a clique.

We are by our very existence a "clique." We are a group of people who interact more regularly and intensely than others. The Chapter officers may be perceived as a clique. The setting may change, but go to any biker function and H.O.G. Members are easy to find. We are a "clique" and it's a good thing.

In most discussions at H.O.T. the word is used in a negative connotation, "How can we get rid of cliques?" I think that is the wrong question. Should not the question be "how do we engage those people who are interacting more and with more intensity?"

We as Chapter Leaders, as Chapter Members, need to not focus on that because we may have a group that prefers to ride together, eat together etc. that is not automatically bad for the Chapter. We instead should focus on welcoming them into the group as a whole and finding ways to let them DO H.O.G.® the way they need to DO H.O.G., DO Chapter they way they need to DO Chapter.

However, if a group of members are acting in a way that is detrimental to the Chapter or the sponsoring dealer then that is an issue. The best way to address this issue is to get together with those members in a non-public, safe setting. Discuss the perceptions of the Chapter; it may be that they just don't feel engaged by the Chapter or its leadership. It may be just a simple lack of communication and understanding. It could be many things, but one thing for sure is that without communication it won't get better. If that does not resolve the issue then a conversation with the sponsoring dealer or H.O.G.® Manager should happen.

I think that if we really think about this, most "cliques" are not bad for the Chapter. They in fact have little or no bearing on the Chapter, how it functions, the rides we do or the fun we have. Embrace those people who chose to hang with their closest friends, eventually they will be the Chapter's closest friends.

When I started in my Chapter life, I rode with two friends, and two friends only. They got me eventually to attend some Chapter events and rides. At those events and rides I rode with my two friends, and only my two friends. I am sure looking back we were viewed as a "clique" but we had nothing in our hearts but riding and having fun. It took a while for us and for the rest of the Chapter to warm up to each other but eventually all three of us became Chapter Officers, served proudly for many years and are still active with our Chapter.

It took both the Chapter Members and the "clique" members to make sure that the situation worked. It took both sides working to find common ground, acceptance, and validation. It's not easy to be an outsider, and in this situation, there are outsiders on both sides. Work as Chapter Officers to be inclusive, to be understanding that not every rider is the same, has the same needs and wants. So long as those "cliques" are doing no evil…Let's just get back to RIDING and HAVING FUN.

When you walk past it sitting in the garage pause for a few seconds and just observe it for any obvious concerns. Take note of the tires, look for loose nuts, bolts, or accessories. You can also do this when approaching the bike after you have parked somewhere.

And, of course, from time to time you should put it on the jack and do a more thorough inspection of brakes, cables, belts, and, while you're at it, check the tire pressure. Most of us enjoy doing a little wrenching so take the opportunity to knock the dust off your tools and tighten up a few things.

Or you can take it to the friendly folks at Timms Harley-Davidson and ask them to do a safety check for you. Practice your riding skills and remember a better rider is a safer rider. Ya'll stay safe out there and try to keep dodging the nut jobs.
