I would like to take this opportunity to thank Christina Copeland for stepping up and taking on the role of Activities Officer along with her Secretary role.

On May 30th, there will be a class on accident scene management which will be instructed by a representative of the ASM/Road Guardians group. The class will be an 8 hour class with lunch provided and will train on first aid, CPR, and what to do at an accident scene until help arrives and is taught by certified instructors and medical professionals. The class is open to anyone and several of our Road Captains have signed up.

One change we made this year for the Mileage Challenge is that the ECHOG officers are no longer recording your start and stop mileage. This year you will take your bike to our sponsor dealership, Timms, and have Rob or Hank in the Service department, verify and log your miles in their system. The challenge starts on the day of the February chapter meeting (2/4/20) and ends on the day of the November chapter meeting (11/3/20). So have fun and RIDE!

One change that Timms made for this year is that they will hold less Bike Nights this year and they will be from 6 PM - 9 PM starting in May (5/7/20) and ending in October (10/1/20). They will still schedule them the first Thursday of the month, May through October and we will be looking for gate duty volunteers for Bike Nights and other events at Timms throughout the year. We are planning on another great year of partnering with the Timms team to hold events and increase awareness of our chapter with the dealership's help.

Our February 22nd chapter Chili Cook Off at Timms was a good example of our partnership with the dealership to hold an event that increases exposure to both that chapter and to Timms who provided the venue and many supplies to make it happen. Of course, it could not have happened without the volunteers who made chili and some yummy deserts that were sold by our LOH group during the cook off. Did you ever wonder how the nickname we wear on our patches, shirts, vests, etc. came to be?

For over a century now, the names Electric City and Anderson have been synonymous. Electric City has a proud history of being used by numerous clubs, organizations and events as a recognizable name for happenings in and around Anderson. Well, there is a history:

1895

Electricity was generated and transmitted six miles from an experimental hydroelectric station on Rocky River into the city of Anderson, the first such transmission in the Southeast.

1897

Electricity was generated and transmitted eleven miles from Portman Shoals Hydroelectric Station on the Savannah River into the city of Anderson, another first.

1897

Oliver Bolt connected his cotton gin to this new source of power, becoming the first gin in the world to operate by electricity.

1898

Anderson Cotton Mill connected to the new power generated by Portman Shoals becoming one of the first major industries in the Southeast to be operated by electricity. 1901

The General Robert Anderson Fountain was placed into operation near the courthouse, becoming the second fountain with underwater lighting in the nation. The fountain is still in operation and is currently located at the Anderson County Museum.

1914

A potential giant in the hydroelectric business, Duke Power Company, bought Anderson Water, Light and Power Company, thus solidifying Anderson's connection to the generation of electricity, and forever tying the names of Electric City and Anderson together. Information provided by Don Williams

Thanks to the historical innovation of Anderson engineer William Whitner, electricity could be conducted by wire to mills throughout the county. Anderson was the first city in the United States to have a continuous supply of electric power, which was supplied by a water mill located in the high shoals area of the Rocky River in Anderson County.

So when you show your pride in being a member of the Electric City HOG Chapter 4769, remember our name has a heritage to be proud of as well.

Riding with the Safety Officer

SAFETY OFFICER NEWSLETTER ARTICLE FEB 2020

Pretty soon we will be laying down some miles as we do some serious springtime riding. The cold temperatures and endless rain has really put a damper on opportunities to ride this winter and hopefully we're going to turn the corner in a few weeks, pun intended. And, with spring, comes daylight saving time which means it will get light later in the morning and stay light later in the evening. One thing that we need to be aware of is the position of the sun when we are riding. Both, how it affects us and how it affects other drivers. Not just when the time changes but all the time.

Riding into the sun is always a challenge because our motorcycles don't have sun visors and when the sun is seemingly rising or setting on the highway that big ole ball of fire makes it difficult to see what's ahead and what's coming at you. There aren't many fixes for this but one thing I've found is that I can use the visor on my helmet to block some of the rays and help with my vision. We also need to understand that when the sun is in the eyes of oncoming traffic those drivers may have a very tough time seeing a motorcycle since it's real easy for us to blend into the sun. Using your high beam headlight(s) may help a little so always run with high beams on during the day. We have also talked about drivers going through red lights and how we should look both ways before we proceed forward when we have the green. Well this is even more important when those drivers are driving into the sun. They may just simply not see the red light.

You and I both know that we have to be on high alert when riding because vehicle drivers make mistakes, take chances, and drive distracted. Sun blindness just exacerbates that, not to mention that some folks can't drive anyway. So, keep your eyes open, your head on a swivel, your brain on red alert mode, and try to keep an escape route mentality. It may just make the difference in whether you make it home next time. And remember to practice your skills. A better rider is a safer rider.
