## **Riding with the Safety Officer**

From the Chapter Safety Officer:

Personal responsibility. What a concept? It seems to me that people just don't take responsibility for their actions these days. There's always some excuse for why something went awry. As most of you know, I believe that each of us is responsible for our own safety. That is not to say that we can avoid every bad thing from happening but I do think that almost everything is preventable either by me or someone else. A motorcycle crash is virtually always caused by something someone does or doesn't do. And, if someone causes them, someone can also prevent them.

At Michelin, we often heard, "Safety is no Accident". There is a twofold meaning there, if we don't have an accident then we are safe, but it also means, if we consciously take the actions necessary to stay safe we won't have an accident. So it is imperative that, as motorcycle riders, we take those necessary actions. Obviously, there may be times when there is nothing we can do to avoid an incident which means someone else did something that caused an accident that we could not prevent. But we can prevent any accident that we may cause and some caused by others if we take the needed precautions.

The first action that I think of is being alert. Doing everything possible to be aware of what is going on around us. Doing our best to minimize surprises. Removing distractions from

the bike or vehicle. That may mean turn off the music or stop screwing around with all of the technology that we have at our disposal now days.

Secondly, being prepared comes to mind. Just like a Boy Scout. Equiping ourselves with all of the knowledge and protection that we can. That, of course, includes continually improving our riding skills by practicing, taking instruction, reading, and learning. Try to anticipate what could happen and formulate a plan, know your escape route, watch, listen, and position ourselves to provide the maximum amount of margin for error. The third thought is knowing my current skill level. Most of us think we are better than we really are. We need to be realistic about our abilities and avoid unnecessary risks or

situations that may be beyond our capability to navigate. Staying out of other drivers' blind spots, keeping our speed under control, not riding/driving when we are too tired, sleepy, cold, hot, under the influence.

There is lots more to say about avoiding or preventing accidents but most readers have already lost interest by now so I'll finish this off.

Assume personal responsibility for your own safety. Largely because you can depend on someone else to do it.

Please be alert at all times regardless of what you're riding/driving and don't take dumb chances with your life or anyone else's. Live free, ride free, and live to ride tomorrow. See you on the highway.
